#### Reminder – Household Hazardous Waste Round-Up in the Fall

Do you have oil-based paints, paint-thinner, cleaning products or adhesives sitting on a shelf in your basement? What about fertilizers, pesticides, sealers, or automotive products? Go through your collection and decide what needs to be eliminated this year. All of these products are hazardous to you, fire fighters, and the environment in the event of a fire. These materials can be collected as part of the annual Household Hazardous Waste Round-Up, which occurs annually in the fall. Please plan ahead. Keep in mind that pressurized containers such as propane tanks (of ANY size, empty or full) are not accepted and should NEVER be stored inside your home due to the risk they pose to you and to fire fighters. If you have any, bring them to the RDCK landfill/transfer stations.

### NELSON POLICE DEPARTMENT

#### A Reminder to Motorists

There is a *Motor Vehicle Act* regulation change to simplify the *Slow Down, Move Over* rule, making it safer for roadside workers. Currently, the *Slow Down, Move Over* regulation requires drivers to reduce speed and, if on a multi-lane road, move over to another lane when passing stopped vehicles with a flashing light, which are considered “official vehicles”. These include: police, ambulance, tow trucks, commercial vehicle safety enforcement vehicles, park rangers and conservation officers. There were concerns that the current regulation does not protect all roadside workers such as highway maintenance workers, garbage collectors etc. The new regulatory amendment includes all vehicles displaying a flashing red, blue or yellow light. This will make it easier for drivers to know the rules of the road, as they will no longer have to check to see if the flashing light is on an “official vehicle”. The amendment will improve safety for all roadside workers and came into effect on Jan. 1, 2015. Drivers must slow their speed to 70km/h when in an 80km/h or over zone, and 40km/h when in an under 80km/h zone. If travelling on a multi-lane road, the driver must move into another lane to pass where safe to do so. The new regulation brings a \$173 ticket and three penalty points.

## OPERATIONS

### ALLEY OBSTRUCTIONS AND RELATED DANGERS

#### The issue:

Some alleys in Nelson are becoming progressively narrower due to residents placing the following on City-owned alleys:

- Structures, in the form of composters, garbage containers, retaining walls and fences
- Overgrown shrubs, trees, and piles of tree clippings
- Vehicles, trailers and boats

#### Why it must be dealt with:

Narrow or impassable alleys create difficult and unsafe passage for:

- City snow plow trucks
- City garbage trucks
- Hydro power line trucks
- Fire trucks
- Ambulance and emergency vehicles
- Police vehicles

#### What you can do to help:

- Place garbage containers, composters and materials onto private property.
- Remove structures encroaching onto City property.
- Trim overhanging trees and shrubs.
- Dispose of combustible materials, including dry leaves, yard and tree clippings.
- Do not park vehicles, trailers or boats in the alley as to obstruct through traffic.

## NELSON HYDRO

### ENERGY USE RECORD!

Nelson Hydro hit an all-time record in January for power usage and power purchase; the highest in over 100 years of operating as an electric utility. On top of our power plants electrical generation of 9.1 MW, we had to purchase an additional 30 MW of power from FortisBC to accommodate the utility’s needs. January’s power bill from FortisBC cost the City just over \$1,000,000. This large bill can be contributed to January’s continuous cold weather for our service area.

This highlights how important electrical conservation and energy efficiency home improvements are within our utility. We can help customers to conserve energy and reduce their electrical bills. ## GARBAGE COLLECTION: WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW!

The City of Nelson completed a three-week trial period with respect to recent amendments to the Waste Management and Wildlife Attractant Bylaw. Council has moved the final amendments through the first three readings. Based on resident feedback and analysis, the City will permit the use of containers. However, it remains the *preference* of the City for garbage bags to be placed for collection outside of a garbage can.

#### The City will permit containers to be used in the following manner:



- Garbage bags will be lifted out of a garbage can by a City employee and placed into the truck;
- Garbage cans will not be lifted by City employees;
- Garbage bags that are not easily removed from cans, will be left in the can;
- Garbage bags must be the correct size or will be left in the can;
- Garbage bags must be the correct weight or will be left in the can; and,
- Garbage bags must have an orange tag on every bag. Untagged bags will be left in the can.

**The maximum weight per bag is 20kgs (44lbs) and the maximum dimension of an unfilled bag is 66cm x 97cm (26” x 38”).**
