After consultation with the Interior Health Authority, the Water Quality Advisory issued on May 9, 2018 due to Elevated Turbidity Levels (cloudiness) is now rescinded. It is safe for all residents serviced by the municipal water system to drink their tap water. The elevated turbidity in our source water, resulting from weeks of warm temperatures and rapid snowmelt from a historically deep snowpack, has decreased to a level where water quality is no longer degraded.

The City continues to monitor water quality at our source and throughout our system however, a significant amount of high mountain snowpack remains to melt. Should water quality change, we will post any future notices on the City's website, through social and print media, radio, and via telephone to users deemed to be at unique risk.
