## Public Works – Winter Operations

### SNOW CLEARING AND SANDING PRIORITIES

Our crews work hard to prepare and maintain 67 kms of roads for winter conditions in Nelson. To ensure your safety on snowy days, use emergency routes and bus routes.

To meet this goal, we prioritize snow clearing and sanding generally as follows:

#### ROADS - Clearing and Sanding:

1. Emergency routes (until the snow event ends)
2. Bus routes (until the snow event ends)
3. All streets that are considered major hills (and are not already cleared)
4. Cross-streets and any other streets that are not already cleared
5. Dead-end streets
6. Lanes and alleys



#### SIDEWALKS, STAIRS & ALLEYS:

- Clear and sand designated (\*) sidewalk routes and stairs.
- Clear residential bus stops and fire hydrants.
- Clear intersections and alley entrances back for improved sight visibility.
- Clear and sand intersection crosswalks, bus stops, and handicapped parking in the downtown area.



(\*) Designated high traffic sidewalks (20 km of the 55 km of sidewalks) will be plowed of snow by City crews.

### DOWNTOWN RULES

1. There is no parking on Baker St. from 2:00 am to 7:00 am from Sunday to Wednesday. Signs are posted and restrictions will be enforced.
2. There is no parking on downtown side streets from 2:00 am to 7:00 am from Thursday to Saturday. Signs are posted and restrictions will be enforced.
3. Business owners and residents are required by Bylaw 3156 to remove snow and ice on their sidewalk by 11:00 am each day (except Sunday or holidays for businesses).

### SNOW WINDROWS ON DRIVEWAYS

Plowing of snow may result in a windrow of snow across private driveways and business accesses. The City of Nelson regrets this; however, we simply do not have the resources to clear these windrows from individual driveways.

### SAND STOCKPILES

- The City uses approximately 3,500 tonnes of sand and 140 tonnes of salt each year for our winter operations.

If you require sand, please note:

- **Sandboxes:** there are dozens of sandboxes all over town.
- **Stockpile:** There is public access for winter sand under the orange bridge by Lakeside Park's boat launch - this sand is for residents who want to pick up a couple of buckets of sand to put on icy sidewalks.
