Our comprehensive four part Liquid Waste Management Plan (LWMP) for Nelson is underway, aiming to revitalize our aging wastewater system and elevate water quality across our major creeks and the Kootenay River.

With a projected investment exceeding \$50 million over the next two decades, this initiative signifies a commitment to long-term environmental stewardship and community well-being.

We invite your valuable insights to ensure that our investments align with local priorities and values. Together, let's continue a path towards a cleaner, healthier, and more resilient Nelson.

The existing wastewater treatment facility has reached its capacity and requires a complete upgrade.

Renew and further develop the existing wastewater treatment facility site to improve treated water quality and be prepared for long-term flow estimates.

Replace marine sewage pipe to match community growth and safeguard Kootenay River water quality.

The existing marine sewer pipe that brings sewage to the wastewater treatment facility has reached its end of service life and requires replacement.

Rainfall and groundwater enters the sewage collection system through direct connections and defects in the sewer pipes and manholes.

Invest in stormwater infrastructure and restoration programs to improve water quality in major creeks, Kootenay River, and shoreline.

Commit funding to limit inflow and infiltration (I&I) by upgrading sewer mains and removing cross connections.
