CRIME PREVENTION TIPS FOR HOME, BUSINESS & VEHICLE



TIPS FOR VEHICLE:



- Don't leave anything of value inside such as charging cords, ID, bank cards, work tools, camera or sunglasses. If they can see it they can steal it.
- Take removable accessories away from view when you're not in the vehicle.
- Install alarm, or flashing light in the vehicle to act as a deterrent to potential thieves. Having these visual & auditory queues can discourage criminals from attempting to break into your vehicle.
- Make sure doors and windows are secured and locked.
- Secure car keys. Do not leave a spare in the vehicle.
- Park in a secure, well- lit area.
- Keep garage door opener out of sight.
- Don't leave car running with keys in vehicle if you're not in it.
- Install anti-theft device like a steering wheel lock/GPS tracker/Immobilizers.

TIPS FOR BUSINESS:



- Secure the premises.
- Hide valuable items in a safe/lock box.
- Move high valued goods away from display windows.
- Install theft prevention system/camera/alarm.
- Security sticker on windows to show you have surveillance.
- Make sure building/surrounding exterior area are well-lit, or install sensor lights to detect movement.
- Keep track of inventory and keep record of serial numbered items.
- Exterior should be kept clean & tidy, and free of garbage.
- Remove any over grown bushes or trees, as they can provide cover for anyone trying to hide from view.
- Leave register open and visible; remove money daily to give impression that it is empty.

TIPS FOR HOME:



- Lock doors and secure windows.
- Don't leave anything valuable lying around, use a safe or lock box to secure.
- Put items of meaning away (jewellery, family heirlooms, money, passports, identification).
- Don't leave house keys hidden outside.
- Frequently change pad lock password for doors/garage entry.
- Keep areas around your house well lit or use sensor motion lights.
- Keep things clean/orderly/tidy around the property.
- Do not post vacation plans on social media.
- Have a trusted friend or neighbour check on your house often- collect the newspaper and packages, mow the lawn, shovel the driveway, park their vehicle in the driveway to make it appear as though someone is home, and living there.
- Consider installing a monitored security system.
