2025 Rates

Nelson Hydro is a caring utility that empathizes with our customers' concern over rising rates because we are customers too. We review our costs annually to ensure that i) customers are receiving value for service, ii) the utility can provide a safe and reliable electric service in compliance with provincial and federal regulations, and iii) the utility provides an equitable return on investment back to the City of Nelson.

What will the 2025 rate increase be?

The rate increase for rural customers (those living outside the City of Nelson municipal boundary) will be 7.54% effective January 1, 2025. The residential rural rate for 2025 will be \$0.1397/kWh. The rate increase for urban customers (those living inside the City of Nelson municipal boundary) will be 5.00% effective January 1, 2025. The residential urban rate for 2025 will be \$0.1279/kWh.

Has the rate increase been approved?

Yes. The urban rate increase for City of Nelson residents has been approved by Nelson's Mayor and Council. The BCUC approved the 2025 rural rate increase on an interim and refundable basis while it formally reviews the Nelson Hydro application.

Why are rates increasing?

The rates are increasing in large part due to the cost to purchase power from FortisBC which is increasing by 5.30% and capital additions to the Nelson Hydro rate base including the new Mill St Substation and pole replacements in 2024 and planned for 2025.

Why do rural customers pay a different rate than urban customers?

The geographically larger area and consequent lower population density means that there is more infrastructure per customer. Further distances, low-density development, longer lines, more equipment, remote conditions, and extensive vegetation management needs in these areas all add up to a higher cost of service.

Does Nelson Hydro offer an Equalized Payment Program?

Yes...Nelson Hydro offers a payment option for monthly equalized payments through automatic debit withdrawals. The monthly amount owing is calculated based on the average of your last 12-month electric consumption. Every Fall the equalized payments are reconciled to calculate the new monthly fee for the next 12 months. What does Nelson Hydro do to give back to the community?



BYLAW CHANGES

On January 1, 2025 the new Nelson Hydro Services Bylaw takes effect. There have been many changes since it was last updated in 2012 to how Nelson Hydro delivers service; technologies, equipment, codes and standards, materials, and staff costs.

On June 20th, 2024 Nelson Hydro hosted an open house to share the proposed updates to the bylaw with the public. It was well attended and several clarifications to the bylaw were made as a result of feedback received. BCUC and City Council approved the changes in October 2024.

Peak Power Demand

Every winter morning, we wake up, turn up the heat, take hot showers, make breakfast, and turn on appliances, gadgets and devices before heading out for the day. In the evenings, we return home and run through a similar routine of cooking, running appliances, using hot water, watching television and using our home computers and devices until bedtime. These daily routines create electrical consumption peaks between 7:00 to 9:00 am and 5:00 to 7:00 pm.

Reducing our electrical consumption between peak hours will ultimately save all customers money by reducing the peak demand fees charged by FortisBC, our wholesale power supplier. Learn more at: nelson.ca/1008/Peak-Demand

TIPS FOR A COZY AND EFFICIENT WINTER

Use Ceiling Fans in Reverse: Running your ceiling fan in reverse at a low speed will help distribute warm air that naturally rises to the ceiling. This can make your space feel warmer without cranking up the heat.

Insulate Your Water Heater: Wrap your water heater in an insulating blanket to reduce heat loss. This is especially important in colder months when your water heater has to work harder to maintain hot water temperatures.

Seal Drafts: Inspect your doors, windows, and any other potential entry points for drafts. Seal any gaps with weatherstripping to prevent warm air from escaping and cold air from entering.




