Diverse and Inclusive Housing Options

- Completed zoning changes to conform with Bill 44 – Small Scale Multi-unit Housing
- Completed Housing Needs Assessment
- Implemented priority recommendations in M’akola non-market housing strategy
 - Support non-profit housing providers
 - Identify surplus city lands
- Supported Housing applications
 - 3 projects – 150+ units
- Applied under Housing Accelerator program
 - Policy changes
 - Infrastructure and housing grants program

Healthy, Connected Neighbourhoods

- OCP is in draft and ready to be presented to Council and the community
- Transit Exchange design finalized, tendered and construction to begin in spring 2025
- Successfully took on the operations of Kootenay Lake West Transit
- Active participant in Selkirk College Bridging Rural Homelessness – phase 2 participation and funding requested
- Support Social Sector
 - Temporary low barrier housing NSI
 - Two Permanent supportive housing projects supported 70+ units
 - Supported grant application – Emergency Treatment Fund

- Utility work in downtown – preparing for Baker Street refresh
- Hall Street Pier Project completed

 - Community Safety Officer
 - Community meetings held, actively working with non-profits
 - Focusing on housing

- Program expansion at Youth Centre

 - Assessing the structural upgrades required in the Rec Campus
 - Civic roof repair
 - Working with NCTS on their project

- Cottonwood Park enhancements
 - New parking area and sidewalks
 - New bridge
- Hall Street Pier
- Lakeside Drive walking and cycling infrastructure
- Replaced Tramway tracks

City Utilities

- Completed phase 1 of Liquid Waste Management Plan
- Completed wildfire mitigation projects in watersheds
- Draft of stormwater and utilities plan for Railtown
- Mountain Station Reservoir project scheduled for 2025
- Mill Street Substation completed
- Expression of Interest submitted for Advanced Metering

Resilience to Natural Hazards

- Continued implementation of the City's Community Wildfire Resiliency Plan (CWRP)
- Continued Implementation and development of the City Emergency Management Program
- Plans have been developed for extreme weather events
 - Grant secured to assess facilities
 - Agreements reached with providers
- Continue to leverage grants to support adaptation and resilience

Future Ready Policies

- Bylaws:
 - Nelson Hydro Service bylaw adopted and approved by BCUC
 - Development Services
 - Records management
- General Cost of Capital decision received which provides similar returns as other small electric utilities
- Unsuccessful in the Water Rights Agreement dispute with BC Hydro
- Bylaws and policies adopted re further implementation of parking strategy
 - Daily parking at parkade
 - Mobile parking
- Policy work completed on reserves and budget 2025 identifies additional funding of reserves

Citizen and Neighbourhood Engagement

- Accessibility Committee formed and is active
- OCP review; RDCK recreation review; Liquid Waste Management Plan

Staff Development

- Active staff committee implementing recommendations under Declaration of Rights of Indigenous Peoples Act
- Leadership training delivered
- Policies adopted to create a more flexible workplace
- Employee Manual developed
- New Health and Safety plan developed
- Bully and harassment training delivered
- AI is being piloted
